COURSE REGISTRATION: Registration on a space-available basis will be accepted up until the course registration deadline. Once a course reaches full enrollment, you have the option of being placed on a waitlist. If a course seat opens, you will be contacted to officially be moved into the course and charged for the course at that point.

COURSE CANCELLATION: Although unlikely, a course may be canceled due to under enrollment or other circumstances beyond BULLI's control. Members will be notified by email of any cancellation and have the option to transfer their registration to another course, request a credit to their ACTIVE account, donate their fee or request a refund.

COURSE DROP POLICY: A written or emailed request (hbrand@brenau.edu) to drop a course for a refund or credit to your ACTIVE account will be honored up to one week before a course begins. There will be a \$5 administrative fee.

WEDNESDAY

WE'VE BEEN TO THE MOON AND WE ARE GOING BACK PART 1

GAINESVILLE FIRST UMC

Three in-person sessions

Part one of this two part course will examine the work that has been done on the lunar surface between 1969 and 1972. As class time allows some time will be spent examining what has been accomplished in crewed spaceflight since the Apollo lunar exploration program ended. The course will be Active Learning based, with participants using dry erase boards to record answers to questions and express opinions. Political and economic effects on NASA programs will also be examined. Information about the astronauts currently training for lunar exploration missions will also be examined.

Frank Lock taught high school astronomy, physics and chemistry for thirty-six years. He received the Distinguished Service Award from the Florida Section of the American Association of Physics Teachers. He was selected as Charlotte County Schools 2005 Teacher of the Year, and was selected as a member of the NASA Network of Educator

Astronaut Teachers in 2004. Lock has done numerous outreach events in Georgia and Florida and was the Gainesville Solar System Scale Model tour guide.

POETRY MATTERS

LANIER VILLAGE ESTATES

The course will begin with an introduction to the poet laureates of the United States and their respective projects, as well as a discussion of why poetry matters and its role in shaping national and personal identities. We will focus on Robert Pinsky's Americans' Favorite Poems project. We will read and discuss poems from his anthology as well as poems from various sources, including poems from other poet laureates.

Students who wish to do so will be invited to share a favorite poem, along with the story of its significance to them. The goal is to increase awareness of, and appreciation for, the important role poetry can and does play in our personal lives and collective history.

Nancy Duffey Story earned her B.A. with a double major in English and social work from LaGrange College. After receiving a master's degree in social work from the University of Georgia with a certificate in gerontology, she earned an M.A. in English and a Ph.D. in English Education from the University of Georgia. She has taught English at Brenau University, North Hall High School, and the University of North Georgia.

THURSDAY

CONFLICT HOT SPOTS

BRENAU CAMPUS

In this course we'll aim to gain a deeper understanding of armed conflict around the world. We'll examine the seventy-five years of antagonism between India and Pakistan; China's increasing assertiveness in the South and East China Seas, the history of murderous conflict in Africa; the complex and sometimes violent relationships in the Middle East; Russia's aggression in its "near abroad", and the unresolved hostility on the Korean peninsula.

We'll look at the geographical and historical background to these conflicts, at how economic and political factors helped shape them, and at the role played by culture and religion. We'll consider the risks posed by conflicts to the broader world community, policy options, and the outlook for resolution.

Today, more than half of the world's population live in cities. In this course, with help from the writings of urbanists and others, we'll look at how cities have evolved and how they might develop in the future. We'll first review the emergence of the early cities and their spread around the world. What did it take for cities to develop to become the 20th century metros we grew up with? We will then discuss our 21st century cities, their importance, their advantages and their problems. How will the changing world, with its social, economic and environmental upheavals, affect them? How has the pandemic impacted cities? Finally, we'll talk about how our cities need to evolve to meet the needs of future generations. What will it take to ensure that cities will be happy, healthy places for our grandchildren and their offspring, to live, work and play in?
