BULLI courses are noncredit, having no exams and no prerequisites. It's learning for the joy of it. You may take as many three-week courses as you wish for \$30 per course, or six-week courses for \$45 per course. Instructors include university professors, community experts and qualified BULLI members who enjoy sharing their knowledge and skills with others. In-person and online courses are offered

for the 2024 summer session. Participants who register by May 13, are eligible to receive an *early bird discount* using coupon code BULLI10 to receive 10% off course fees and the summer prorated membership dues (for those who have not previously paid their dues for the 2023-24 program year). Other fees and special programs offered are not eligible for the discount.

Participants who register by May 13, are eligible to receive an early bird discount using coupon code BULLI10 to receive 10% off course fees and spring prorated membership dues. COURSE REGISTRATION: Registration on a space-available basis will be accepted up until the course registration deadline. Once a course reaches full enrollment, you have the option of being placed on a waitlist. If a course seat opens, you will be contacted to officially be moved into the course and charged for the course at that point.

COURSE CANCELLATION: Although unlikely, a course may be canceled due to under enrollment or other circumstances beyond BULLI's control. Members will be notified by email of any cancellation and have the option to transfer their registration to another course, request a credit to their ACTIVE account, donate their fee or request a refund.

COURSE DROP POLICY: A written or emailed request (cenochs@ brenau.edu) to drop a course for a refund or credit to your ACTIVE account will be honored up to one week before a course begins. There will be a \$5 administrative fee.



SUMMER 2024 ACTIVITIES AND WEATHER CLOSINGS:

- In-person, remote and hybrid courses are clearly indicated in the summer session course schedule within this newsletter. In-person courses for all BULLI members are hosted on Brenau's historic Gainesville campus and Gainesville First United Methodist Church. Remote courses are hosted on Zoom. Courses specifically for Lanier Village Estate residents are also clearly indicated.
- Prior to participating in BULLI special interest groups,
 BULLI members must register online for their desired special interest group once during the program year, just like they would register for a BULLI course. There is

- no extra charge for BULLI members to participate in a special interest group.
- In the event of inclement weather, you will need to watch the news or listen to the radio for school closings. **BULLI** does not follow Brenau closings. Since we have students coming from a number of outlying areas, BULLI classes and other activities are canceled when Hall County Schools are closed. This also applies to remote Zoom courses, as we tend to experience spotty power and internet outages in our region during severe weather. IMAGE, MYTH, AND STORY: GIFTS OF SPIRITUAL IMAGINATION IN CHALLENGING TIMES

BRENAU CAMPUS

Three in-person sessions Cost: \$30 11:00 a.m. - 12:20 p.m. June 3, 10, 17

As we face these challenging days, how can we nurture a practice of spiritual imagination that can transform the way we live in the world? In this class, we will explore key moments from the stories of our lives, and we will connect them with pivotal moments in the stories, myths, and legends that have helped shape our sense of who we are. We will explore crucial stories from the Biblical texts as well as legends, myths, and images that can help us ground ourselves in a greater awareness and a practice of presence that nurtures hope. When we encounter such tension and anxiety, we are called to pay attention to where we find meaning, and we have beautiful resources at our disposal that can reorient our lives.

The Rev. Dr. Stuart Higginbotham is the rector of Grace Episcopal Church. A priest, poet, and author, he is the author of the forthcoming poetry collection Bones of Light. His vocation centers on the connections between contemplative practices, spiritual imagination, and congregational development.

FOUR GREAT READS FOR SUMMER

Three in-person sessions Cost: \$30 12:30 - 1:50 p.m. June 3, 10, 17

This course is for those who love to read, and it will offer outstanding suggestions for this summer's reading selections. We will begin with Kristen Hannah's just published historical fiction The Women. The Color of Water by James McBride is next, a memoir which received both critical and popular acclaim. We will end with two short stories which will be provided on the first day of class, one by Raymond Carver and another by Budd Schulberg. What a lovely way to begin summertime!

Bill Coates holds a Ph.D. in American literature from the University of South Carolina and a Master of Divinity from Southeastern Theological Seminary. He is retired from the pastorate and still has a passion for teaching. Bill has taught for BULLI going on 23 years and has been a BULLI staff member since 2019.

AMERICAN MAH JONGG

AFTER I DIE: WHAT MY EXECUTOR WILL NEED TO KNOW

When you die, will your executor know who to contact? Will they be lost in your house, trying to find financial records? Will they even know what questions they should have asked you while you were still alive? Be kind to your executor by answering all their questions before you risk being unable to answer them. This three-session course, based on Fran Stewart's newest book, After I Die: What My Executor will Need to Know, will get you started on that journey.

Fran Stewart is known to the BULLI community for her interactive courses in Memoir-Writing. She is the author of 28 books – mysteries, a writer's workbook, memoirs, and a bi-lingual book for children. She has a clear-headed approach to the irrefutable fact that we all will die and is doing her best to help others make that transition easier for their families.



This three-session course will provide participants with information about the science involved in space exploration. It will be interactive, with participants encouraged to participate in activities designed to provide them with understanding of the concepts presented. These will include information about telescopes, rocket flight, characteristics of planets, human spaceflight, and more.

Frank Lock has taught high school astronomy, has been an advocate for human space exploration since 1961, and is a member of the Network of Educator Astronaut Teachers.

WHO IS VLADIMIR PUTIN

Vladimir Putin was just elected for a fifth term as the Russian Federation President. In the last 30-plus years he has tried to restore the glory and influence of Imperial Russia. Instead, the Russian Federation has remained a Third World economy with a first world military. Putin, experiencing the U.S. and NATO's efforts to stop aggression in Eastern Europe, has confronted united efforts from the West. The outcome is anyone's guess. Can NATO forces thwart his grand scheme?

LOST MILL TOWNS OF NORTH GEORGIA

ZOOM

Three remote sessions Cost: \$30 12:30 - 1:50 p.m. June 6, 13, 20

I hear them. And I want you to hear them too. We ignore them or just half-listened to their stories. We drive by their homes in the mill villages and there, before decay has hidden its history, if you stop long enough, you might notice them. The mill village towns of North Georgia often are hidden by repurpose and decay. Driving along you might see a lonely stack, or two, and down the road, you look into the past. You might see a neat row of similar, yet dissimilar homes still teeming with life next to a long-abandoned textile mill. A heavy pall surrounds the mill towns of North Georgia because the Southern textile mill is dead. Learn about the Mill Era in North Georgia and Fulton County and how it influences our present.

Lisa M. Russell has published five books on Georgia history and is currently working on the sixth. She serves as the English Dean of Georgia Northwestern Technical College as well as an English instructor. She also is a part-time Communication professor at Kennesaw State University. Lisa received her MA in Professional Writing at KSU where she was honored in 2020 with the Alumni of the Year Award. She gave a Ted Talk in 2022 and speaks all over the state to history lovers.

THE AMERICAN REVOLUTIONARY WAR IN GEORGIA – DIFFERENT IN MANY WAYS

Georgia's role in the American Revolution was unlike that of the other twelve colonies. Who were the 'Reluctant Rebels?' How did the war differ in the North and the South? This course also includes political stories and newly discovered details of the Battle of Kettle Creek.

Popular instructor Carter J. Wood is president of the Lyman Hall Chapter of the Georgia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution in Gainesville. Wood has a B.S. in business and is a retired corporate trainer who has volunteered 50 years with the Boy Scouts of America.
